THEORY OF ACTION

All students in Louisiana should spend the majority of their time reading, speaking, writing, and solving curriculum-based tasks. To enhance their success, students with disabilities often benefit from additional support. They may benefit from:

- Educators equipped to deliver specialized supports to meet the unique needs of students with disabilities.
- Direct services from certified providers to accomplish specific goals outlined in a student's individual educational program.

PURPOSE

The Partnerships for Success Guide provides school systems with a list of partners that can provide professional development to build the capacity of educators to deliver specialized supports and organizations that can fulfill the direct service needs to support students with disabilities.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: SPECIALIZED SUPPORTS FOR EDUCATORS

All students should spend the majority of their time reading, speaking, writing, and solving curriculum-based tasks. However, students with disabilities face additional challenges because they need educators that can deliver specialized support in the areas of communication, assistive technology, functional skills, sensory and environment, and executive functioning. To provide specialized supports, educators need targeted professional development. When equipped with knowledge and strategies in these areas of specialized support, educators can more adequately address the unique needs of students with disabilities and ensure meaningful engagement in the classroom every day. Descriptions of specialized support areas can be located on page 4 and provide potential partners and school systems a common understanding of the type of professional development a particular organization might offer and how they can support specific areas of need for students with disabilities.

DIRECT SERVICES: CERTIFIED PROVIDERS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Direct services assist students with disabilities in engaging in classrooms across Louisiana every day. These services are critical in ensuring students can grow and thrive. Pages 15-23 of this guide provide an inventory of organizations, often utilizing alternative and innovative methods of delivery, that are capable of providing direct services to students with disabilities or professional development for continuing the delivery of direct services across alternative (e.g. distance learning) delivery methods.

Children across Louisiana's early childhood programs should receive high-quality early learning experiences that include supportive interactions between teachers and children grounded in the use of high-quality curricula. To ensure access to these interactions and high-quality curricula, children with disabilities can benefit from early childhood educators who are equipped to deliver specialized supports. Organizations denoted with the Early Childhood icon provide targeted professional development opportunities for early childhood educators in delivering specialized supports to children with disabilities.

P PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR SPECIALIZED SUPPORT

The Department has categorized specialized support areas frequently utilized to support the unique needs of students with disabilities. Professional development for school systems and educators may simultaneously encompass more than one specialized support area. The descriptions provided for areas of specialized support are intended to help school systems and vendors develop a common understanding of the type of professional development a particular organization might provide as well as how they can support the unique needs of students with disabilities.

COMMUNICATION

Communication-focused professional development supports educators in breaking down barriers that would impede students with disabilities from receiving or expressing information. Specialized supports in the area of communication help students across disability categories including, but not limited to, students that are deaf, hard of hearing, visually impaired, or students with limited to no verbal skills.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

Professional development in the area of assistive technology builds the capacity of educators and school systems to identify and implement devices and services that support meaningful engagement across settings for students with disabilities.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Functional skills such as hygiene, community-based navigation, and self-advocacy are often included in the individual educational plan for students with disabilities and enable students to function as independently as possible. Equipping educators to provide specialized support that develops the functional skills of students with disabilities promotes independence both academically and beyond the school setting.

SENSORY/ENVIRONMENT

Sensory-based specialized support can aid school systems in shaping physical environments to suit student needs and in developing the skill set of students with disabilities to experience, understand, and appropriately respond to environmental stimuli.

EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING & SELF-REGULATION

Mental processes such as sustaining attention, remembering directions, and managing multiple tasks simultaneously can present challenges for students with disabilities. Professional development includes empowering educators with tools and strategies to strengthen the executive functioning and self-regulation skills of students with disabilities.
